A Message from our Minister

If I was to ask you what your hobbies or self-interests were, I am sure you would have a long list of things that you like to do and if not, then at least one or two. Each of us has a special interest in something that we enjoy or derive enjoyment from. However, in order to do any of these special interests there is one factor that they would all have in common and that is time.

Many of us have pressures from duties and roles that we must do in life that impede on our time and very often hinder us from doing the things we would like to do. That may be a demanding job, a busy social life, caring for loved one who is sick or juggling studies and work at the same time. Whatever it may be, there is a constant demand on our time.

Yet, no matter how busy you we are, we often make time to do the things we love. We devote precious time to pursue the hobbies and self-interests that we enjoy doing. There is nothing inherently wrong with having a hobby or pursuing an interest. Nevertheless, in all these pursuits and time pressures we often neglect the most important of all and that is God.

Often you hear the complaint when speaking about God and our waning devotion to Him, "He understands", "I have my own thing with God", "I can't sit still to read or pray", or the classic, "I don't have the time". If we're truthful and honest with ourselves, we'll see that these are excuses. Furthermore, if we stop to think about it, we will find that much of what we concern ourselves with is of no eternal value. (cont.overleaf)

Many of us give our time to the temporal things, to things that don't last with little regard to that which is eternal, everlasting and which fades not away. Our investment of time should not be in this life or in our own self-interest but in God and eternity. Far better to invest in that which fades not away than to labour and spend your strength on things that are passing away.

We would do well to take instruction from the old hymn that touches upon this topic: "Take time to be holy, speak oft with Thy Lord; abide in Him always, and feed on His Word".

It goes on to say in the second verse:

"Take time to be holy, the world rushes on; Spend much time in secret, with Jesus alone. By looking to Jesus, like Him thou shalt be; Thy friends in thy conduct His likeness shall see".
