Introduction

All the people worked together to rebuild the wall around Jerusalem. There were many setbacks, but after just 52 days the wall was complete. Ezra read from God's book and the people praised God together.

Bible References:

Ephesians 2:10 – For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

Colossians 3:23 – Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men.


Isaiah 41:10 – So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.

1 Samuel 7:12 – Then Samuel took a stone and set it up between Mizpah and Shen. He named it Ebenezer, saying, "Thus far the LORD has helped us."
